Support for New Zealand Food and Beverage Businesses

The High-Value Nutrition (HVN) Ko Ngā Kai Whai Painga National Science Challenge has been supporting the food and beverage (F&B) industry through the provision of funding and scientific support to increase the value of products through validation of their health benefits. Funding for HVN will end on 30 June 2024.

There is currently no clear dedicated pathway for these types of activities in the New Zealand publicly-funded system. To support businesses, HVN has compiled a list of public and private agencies and support systems that may be able to support our industry partners in the future.

This is not a comprehensive list of all agencies and funding support available in New Zealand and is a selection of those with an F&B focus that HVN has engaged with.

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HIGH-VALUE NUTRITION Ko Ngã Kai Whai Painga Challenge MBIE's purpose is to grow Aotearoa New Zealand for all. We support the science system, and fund research and innovation both directly and through other funding agencies such as Callaghan Innovation, Royal Society Te Apārangi and the Health Research Council of New Zealand.

We directly manage a set of contestable research funds including:

- <u>The Endeavour Fund</u>, with a focus on both research excellence and a broad range of impacts.
- <u>Te Pūnaha Hihiko: Vision Mātauranga Capability Fund</u> invests in the development of skilled people and organisations that plan to undertake, or are undertaking, research that supports the themes and outcomes of our Vision Mātauranga policy.
- <u>Expanding the impact of Vision Mātauranga</u>, which aims to attract and grow Māori talent in the Research, Science and Innovation sector enabling Māori to better navigate and participate in the research system, through a range of funding schemes.

It is worth noting that contestable funds are available to projects that can demonstrate broad public good outcomes – that is direct benefit beyond the organisation hosting a project or programme.

We note support for private companies through the <u>R&D Tax Incentive administered through</u> IRD.

MBIE also funds the <u>Commercialisation Partner Network</u> (CPN) and the Pre-Seed Accelerator Fund (PSAF), which aims to support the transfer of concepts coming from publicly-funded research out of our CRIs and Universities and into commercially viable products. These funds are devolved to CPN organisations like KiwiNet and Return on Science to administer for internal projects (to build capability and Intellectual Property [IP]). Industry organisations can connect with these CPN organisations regarding potential research partners, and in addition, Return on Science operates investment committees which are open to providing feedback on investment cases to some external (non-research) organisations.

Ministry of Primary Industries (MPI)

The MPI Sustainable Food and Fibre Futures (SFF Futures) supports problem-solving and innovation in New Zealand's food and fibre sector by co-investing in initiatives that make a positive and lasting difference. It funds a range of projects from less than \$100,000 to multi-million-dollar, multi-year programmes.

The scope of the SFF Futures Fund is broad and is not limited to any particular part of the food and fibre sector. Proposals may cover one or more parts of the value chain – new products, technology and services, and new ways of operating, producing, marketing, handling and distributing.

The New Zealand Food Safety side of MPI can provide ongoing technical advice to food businesses regarding the regulations for the composition of foods and supplemented foods, as well as planning to meet the Nutrition and Health Claims Standard. We don't have a large resource at present, but we hope to build on this in the future, as we have an objective to assist in adding value to foods through the use of science to support proven claims.
